

The William Adkins Legacy Society

The William Adkins Legacy Society of the Adkins Arboretum is established to honor those persons who have chosen to support the endowment of the Arboretum through a planned or deferred gift, such as a bequest, Charitable Gift Annuity, Charitable Lead Trust, Charitable Remainder Annuity Trust, Charitable Remainder Unitrust, and many more. Individuals automatically become members of the Society once the Arboretum receives notification of their planned gift, unless they specifically decline membership. Members of the Society are mentioned in the Arboretum's annual report and are invited to attend the annual William Adkins Legacy Society reception.

William H. Adkins, II, the Arboretum's namesake, was born into a family of lawyers and judges with ties to Maryland's Eastern Shore. Adkins served as a judge of the Maryland Court of Appeals and was a leading civil rights advocate, as well as environmentalist. His love of trees and nature led his friend and the Arboretum's benefactor, Leon Andrus, to name the Arboretum after him.

Investing In the Future Through Planned Giving

There are a number of ways that you can invest in the future of Adkins Arboretum through the Planned Giving Program. The easiest and most frequently used is through a bequest in your will or trust or you can designate the Arboretum as the beneficiary of an IRA or a 401K account. Another common way to support organizations such as ours is to designate the Arboretum as beneficiary on a life insurance policy. Real estate or other real assets may also be accepted. And a number of options are available through the arrangement of charitable trusts. Your tax advisor will be helpful to you in understanding the tax advantages of each of these options.

We encourage you to consult with your attorney to prepare appropriate wording in the case that you choose to make a bequest through your will. If your will is already in place, there is no need to have it rewritten. A simple codicil, prepared by your attorney along the following lines, is all that is required:

"I bequeath to Adkins Arboretum, a not-for-profit organization, the sum of _______ (% or \$) of my residual estate for Adkins Arboretum. If, at the time of my death, the Arboretum should no longer exist, the Arboretum's Board of Trustees may use these funds as they deem appropriate."
